

A Few Reminders To Authors/Speakers

- Your paper must be an original and unpublished work that is not pending publication elsewhere.
- Your PowerPoint presentation (the visuals you show during your talk) does not qualify as a “paper.” Your session organizer and the NASF staff would like to review your PowerPoint presentation as well as your paper before the conference.
- Copyright Clearance—It is expected that any paper submitted for publication will have received appropriate clearance from your company. The copyright release form included in this kit must be signed by the author and submitted along with the copy of the paper.
- You are expected to prepare your paper in accordance with the title and abstract you submitted that was subsequently edited by NASF staff for publication in promotional materials. *If there are extenuating circumstances that make it impossible for you to present that particular paper*, please discuss it with the session chairman or conference organizer well in advance of the paper deadline. **Please do not change the title, content or subject of the paper without checking with the chairman or organizer first.** If your change is approved, then notify the NASF staff.
- Your paper must be suitable for presentation at an open meeting.
- You agree to personally present the paper. If an emergency arises and it is not possible for you to present the paper, please designate someone else from your company to present the paper for you, and be sure to inform NASF staff.
- In the case of multiple authors, only one person is expected to present the paper. Only one person will receive the complimentary registration offered per paper.

Important! You agree to abide by NASF's policy of omitting proprietary or trade names in the paper and accompanying audiovisual materials or PowerPoint presentation.
